There are over 400,000 young people aged between 11 and 14 years attending secondary schools across Greater London. Our aim is to reach every child with vital safety messages to keep them safe.

The Children's Safety Education Foundation (CSEF), have developed a unique online resource called 'Street-Vibe'. Topics covered include staying safe and in control, alcohol, drugs and solvent misuse, car crime, shoplifting, racial harassment, anti-social behaviour, guns, gangs and knives, criminal damage and counter terrorism. It is easily accessible, engaging and helps promote effective learning within the classroom.

'Street-Vibe' is designed to complement the Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education syllabus and covers hazards that young people may encounter in their everyday lives. Most importantly, 'Street-Vibe' supports your Safer Schools Programme which aim to keep young people safe and prevent problems with youth crime before they escalate.

This year, all Secondary schools are to be given free online access to this resource and we would encourage you to register your school at the earliest opportunity. Once you have registered your details, a licence key will be sent to you with simple instructions on how to access the resource.
